Keynote Headliner John Medina **Friday, October 22 | 8:00am CT**

John Medina is a developmental molecular biologist at the University of Washington School of Medicine (Department of Bioengineering). His research interests focus on the genes behind brain development and psychiatric conditions. He was the Founding Director of the Talaris Research Institute, studying how infants encode and process information at the cognitive, cellular and molecular level.

Dr. Medina spent most of his professional life as an analytical research consultant, working primarily in the biotechnology and pharmaceutical industries on research related to mental health. Dr. Medina unlocks solutions and explains the fascinating inner-workings of the human brain with his trademark humor and enthusiasm. Dr. Medina (known as the 'brain doctor') will discuss attention and multi-tasking.



Keynote – Featuring Mona Masood, DO **Friday, October 22 | 8:00am CT**

Mona Masood, DO, is a board certified general outpatient psychiatrist practicing in the greater Philadelphia area. She is a member of the Board of Directors of the Muslim Wellness Foundation, an American nonprofit mental health awareness and education organization. Dr. Masood often leads community mental health education events and is most recently the founder and chief organizer of the Physician Support Line - an anonymous and free peer-to-peer emotional support line run by over 800 volunteer psychiatrists to help physician colleagues with many intersections of their personal and professional lives. As founder of the Physician Support Line, Dr. Masood will discuss the creation of the support line, how and why it was constructed, who volunteers and the programs successes.

Keynote Headliner Lisa Leslie **Saturday, October 23 | 8:00am CT**

Lisa Leslie is the most recognized player of both the WNBA and Team USA, who brought considerably more than a stunning visage and statuesque body to the court. Throughout her storied career, Ms. Leslie was the absolute most dominant player in the women's game.

Ms. Leslie carried the gold-winning Team USA in 1996, 2000, 2004, and 2008. With the 2008 gold medal, she became the first team sport athlete to win four consecutive Olympic Gold Medals. In 2001, Lisa was the first WNBA player to win the regular-season MVP, the All-Star Game MVP, and the playoff MVP in the same season and is the first woman to slam-dunk in a professional game. Ms. Leslie was inducted into both the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, in 2015. Ms. Leslie authored her own book "Don't Let the Lipstick Fool You" in 2008, and in 2010 became the first WNBA player turned Co-Owner of the Los Angeles Sparks. In 2012, she both received her Masters in Business Administration from the University of Phoenix and launched the Lisa Leslie Basketball & Leadership Academy. Ms. Leslie will highlight her experience in being a dominate WNBA player to becoming a co-owner of a WNBA team to launching her leadership academy.

Meena Seshamani, MD, PhD, is the Deputy Administrator and Director of Center for Medicare.
