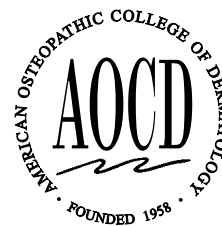

Addiction Medicine

The **American Osteopathic Academy of Addiction Medicine (AOAAM)** will have a central theme of advancing addiction medicine and innovations in substance use disorder treatment. As part of OMED25, this specialized track on substance use disorder (SUD) treatment brings together leading experts to explore the latest advancements in addiction medicine. Sessions will cover innovative therapies such as Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS) and GLP-1 receptor agonists, best practices for behavioral assessments, and specialized approaches for unique patient populations—including healthcare professionals, LGBTQ individuals, and obstetric patients. Designed for osteopathic physicians and healthcare providers, this track will provide practical strategies and cutting-edge research to enhance patient care and improve treatment outcomes. Join us at OMED to stay at the forefront of addiction medicine and network with leaders in the field.

Allergy and Immunology

The **American Osteopathic College of Allergy and Immunology (AOCAI)** will present lectures covering topics on precision approaches to asthma treatment, precision approaches to insect venom hypersensitivity, anaphylaxis, and approaches to contact dermatitis. In addition, we will provide a lecture covering updates on the current recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Vaccination Practices (ACIP) and the Center for Disease Control (CDC).

Dermatology

The **American Osteopathic College of Dermatology (AOCD)** is proud to provide educational courses for OMED25 in Nashville and to the virtual OMED25 platform. All AOCD CME activities are planned by a committee comprised of AOA Board-Certified Osteopathic Dermatologists. The AOCD will provide a diversified CME program focusing on the art and science of Dermatology. Information will be presented through lectures. Join the AOCD sessions and update your knowledge on topics ranging from dermatology history, treatments for skin of color, rural dermatology, practice management tips, contact dermatitis, and other interesting topics. As a result of attending these activities, physicians will gain knowledge in helping patients to change their behavior to assist them in their treatment.

Emergency Medicine

The **American College of Osteopathic Emergency Physicians (ACOEP)** will cover emergency medicine in various settings, including the family medicine office, urgent care, and emergency departments. The information presented, developed by ACOEP, will be valuable to physicians in both community and academic settings. Though comprehensive in scope, the lecture format will be abbreviated presentations by speakers of various related and complementary specialties.

Family Medicine

The **American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP)** offers a diverse range of educational sessions covering innovative topics in Family Medicine. As Family Medicine plays a crucial role in healthcare, ACOFP ensures that its members are equipped with the latest knowledge and skills in the field. In collaboration with sister societies, ACOFP also provides interdisciplinary education, allowing healthcare professionals to learn from and collaborate with colleagues from different disciplines. With a focus on comprehensive and holistic healthcare, ACOFP is dedicated to advancing the practice of Family Medicine and promoting excellence in patient care.

Military

The **Association of Military Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons (AMOPS)** has developed sessions that will introduce attendees to Military Medicine: on Land, Sea, and Air, as well as Military Medicine: Front Lines to Civilian Trauma Centers, to treating our VA patients! Sessions include aerospace medicine, medical support to the warfighter, integrating military medicine in the civilian world, burn care, TBI, FAST exams, treating our VA patients, and a demonstration of Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine's (OMM) use on the battlefield, shipboard, and flightlines. Both military physicians and civilian physicians will benefit from these sessions.

Neurology/Psychiatry

The **American College of Osteopathic Neurologists and Psychiatrists (ACONP)** educational sessions will cover a range of topics in the fields of Neurology and Psychiatry to include NMDA receptor encephalitis in children and adolescents, the use of muscle MRI in the diagnosis and treatment of myopathies, dizziness and vertigo with neuro-rehab options, neuromyelitis optica syndrome, chart etiquette, prolonged cardiac monitoring in search of atrial fibrillation, the role of guanfacine for adult ADHD, and much more.

Occupational and Preventive Medicine

The **American Osteopathic College of Occupational and Preventive Medicine (AOCOPM)** will address current occupational, environmental, and preventive medicine topics. Topics will be divided into three divisions: public health and general preventive medicine, occupational medicine, and aerospace medicine. Focus areas within these divisions include correctional medicine, undersea hyperbaric medicine, and disability impairment medicine.

Osteopathy

The **American Academy of Osteopathy (AAO)** will showcase distinguished faculty discussing the concepts of turning DISability to ability through the treatment of the extremities and beyond. Previous trauma can cause obvious deformity or restricted movement, especially within the extremities, but also that which is invisible, such as anxiety, depression, PTSD, and complex chronic pain. We will explore the hands-on treatment of these conditions in our workshops. Additionally, in our virtual sessions, we will explore the utilization of technology to help with osteopathic education and patient care.

This engaging program will provide attendees with comprehensive and state-of-the-art information about how physicians can diagnose and treat these and other conditions in a comprehensive manner, including utilization of a wide variety of OMT approaches.

Pediatrics

The **American College of Osteopathic Pediatricians (ACOP)** plans to address current topics related to the care of children, including sessions on neonatal/perinatal medicine, pediatric weight management, pediatric infectious disease, autism, pediatric oncology/hematology, dermatology, and OMM/OMT. ACOP is also planning a joint session with the American Osteopathic Academy of Sports Medicine (AOASM).

Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation

The **American Osteopathic College of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (AOCPRM)** program will focus on optimizing physiatry and physical medicine and rehabilitation in today's healthcare environment. Educational session topics include interventional spine, sports medicine, electrodiagnosis, and OMT. The Innovations in Rehabilitation segment includes presentations on wearables and motion capture in rehabilitation, the role of physiatry in cellular therapy, and AI in documentation.

Prolotherapy Regenerative Medicine

The **American Osteopathic Association of Prolotherapy Regenerative Medicine (AOAPRM)** program starts with the basic skills required to perform a prolotherapy treatment. Platelet-rich plasma (PRP) is discussed as an advanced prolotherapy treatment for cases that are more complicated. The latest treatment modalities for the cervical, lumbar, and thoracic spine will be covered. Each day, the didactic sessions will conclude with practical clinical assessments.

Sports Medicine

The **American Osteopathic Academy of Sports Medicine (AOASM)** will present "Sports Medicine: A Pathway to Treating All Patients." The program includes sports medicine topics relevant to physicians in all specialties, highlighting the dual clinical missions of promoting exercise as medicine for all people and providing sports medicine care to all people. We will provide an in-depth review of common musculoskeletal conditions including diagnostic evaluation, management, and return-to-play considerations across pediatric, adolescent, adult, geriatric, and disabled athlete populations. The program will also explore new ideas in clinical practice, apply evidence-based research, and connect with diverse patients. All topics will highlight the osteopathic approach to evaluation and management. The following specialties are offering virtual content for OMED25 On Demand, which will be available beginning at 12 p.m. on Sunday, September 28.

Anesthesiology

The **American Osteopathic College of Anesthesiologists (AOCA)** will address the medical skills necessary for anesthesia practice. Participants can align their practice goals to stay current with medical education and improve patient outcomes. Sessions will cover critical updates in the anesthesia sub-specialties including regional, cardiac, obstetrics, pediatrics, and pain management, as well as improving surgical outcomes for patients.

Hematology

The **American Society of Hematology (ASH)** will provide robust, current educational content, including understanding chronic leukemias, CAR T-cell therapy, sickle cell disease, abnormal newborn screens, overview of peripheral blood and bone marrow assessment, easy bleeding and bruising, palliative care approaches, diagnosing and managing acute thrombocytopenia, CLL, cell therapy, common CBC abnormalities, the pathway to cure multiple myeloma, and pediatric sickle cell care for the general physician. This wide range of current, high-interest topics for all osteopathic physicians and medical students will help inform clinical practices, increase awareness, and educate patients.

Internal Medicine

The **American College of Osteopathic Internists (ACOI)** will have sessions on cardiology, palliative care, geriatric medicine, pulmonary medicine, endocrinology, infectious disease, nephrology, allergy medicine, oncology, rheumatology, artificial intelligence (AI) in medicine, and gastroenterology. Educational sessions will include updating physicians on new inflammatory disease medications, learning how to treat patients without a GLP-1 prescription, discussing how to deal with difficult end-of-life nutrition issues, introducing AI tools and future applications for physicians, and more. ACOI is very excited to be able to provide virtual internal medicine CME during OMED25!

Obstetrics/Gynecology

The **American College of Osteopathic Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOOG)** will address common and uncommon health issues unique to women and physicians from multiple specialties that provide women's healthcare.
